Brig Fornax, Cook, from Aux Cayes, arrived on Saturday of the bar, and was ordered to Boston. Sixty-three American vessels had discharged at Aux Cayes since 1st Oct 1815. Markets intolerably dull; codfish \$2 50 a 3, duty and charges 10 cents; scale fish \$1, same duty; mackerel 7; beer No. 1, 13 a 14; pork 20; butter 16 cts; lard 16; cheese nothing at all; hams 16; flour \$3 50 a 9; lumber, W. P. 16; pitch pine 25, shingles 1 50, staves; shooks & hoops in no demand. Coffee 25 cents without canks or bags.

Schr Lady Brooks, Orne, Halifax, 7. Left, May 25, schr Retrive, Hawes, 11 days from New-York. The Vixen, arrived at Halifax, spoke, May 11, lat. 39 33, 30, lon. 61, 8, brig Aurora, from Aberdeen, for N. York, 35 days, very lenky. Flour at Halifax, \$5 60; corn 50 cents; salt \$2 20 per hhd. and rising, there being none in port. ... At quarantine, brig Olive, Lumt, St. Salvador, via St. Thomas. Left at Bahia, March 26, brig Esther, Hamar, of Charleston, S. C. next day. [This vessel left Charleston previous to the war, and it was generally supposed that the vessel had been unjustly detained from her owners, and the capt. had converted her earnings to his own use.] May 8, lat. 14 6, lon. 55 16, was fired into, and boarded by a spanish galleonman, mounting 18 guns, from Africa, with slaves—we were boarded by 11 men, armed with muskets, pistols and cutlasses, who immediately drove the people forward, knocked down and severely wounded one with the butt end of a musket, and then commenced a search for plunder, and after having ransacked the vessel throughout, and stealing my liquors, fowls from the coops, and sundry articles of clothing, &c. they left, insolently ordering me not to make sail till they were out of sight.
